St Hilda's employs more than 300 dedicated staff who teach and support our students across our three campuses.

Governed by a School Council, and supported by a School Foundation, the School is well positioned to realise its potential. The School Executive oversees the day to day running of the school and works closely with School Council to embed our values of Excellence, Belonging, Authenticity and Imagination throughout our community.

Our Campuses and Facilities

Situated across two campuses, the Junior School and Senior School campuses are located in Mosman Park, just a two-minute drive between each.

Our regional campus is based in Pemberton and is used for outdoor education, wellbeing programs and curriculum retreats.

The Junior School is an expansive campus surrounded by native bushland and a short walk to the river. Spacious and fresh, the classrooms offer a range of internal and external learning areas.

The Senior School campus is a mix of traditional and contemporary learning environments, including a state-of-the-art performing arts centre, heated pool and spacious staffroom.

Parking is available onsite (undercover at the Senior School). A fitness centre and heated pool are available for staff to use outside of school hours.

The Bay Café on the Senior School campus provides discounted barista coffees throughout the day, as well as nourishing food made by our award-winning chefs on the premises.

The Yeagarup Campus, based in Pemberton, is available for staff to hire at a discount during school holidays. The chalets make an ideal retreat for those wanting a quiet, self-contained retreat for small families and couples.

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The Recruitment Process

Positions are advertised both internally, via our expression of interest database and on Seek. While you may receive an email from the school to apply all other candidates are welcome to apply through Seek. Job descriptions are available on the website. Please ensure you have a covering letter that summarises your interest in the role, a resume and contact details for three professional referees.

At times, you may receive a phone call from the hiring party as an initial conversation. All shortlisted candidates will be interviewed in person, where possible. As part of the recruitment process for teaching staff, you may be required to demonstrate your teaching expertise in a designated class.

Referees of the preferred candidate will be contacted.

3

The preferred candidate may be asked to undertake a psychometric assessment prior to being offered the role. This is a short online questionnaire which can be done remotely.

International candidates will need to have relevant visa documentation to support their right to work in Australia.

5

If the right candidate is not found through this recruitment process, an appointment will not be made.

6

All candidates will be informed of the final status of their application at the end of the recruitment process.
